Our Values

Developmental

We value the developmental picture of human consciousness given as a basis for this education by Rudolf Steiner. We believe children need to play, to be part of nature, and to enjoy a time free from the early commercialisation of childhood. We understand that a healthy childhood provides the foundation for ongoing wellbeing in later life.

Balanced

We value this uniquely balanced education which integrates academic excellence with practical learning and creative and performing arts. This nurtures the development of clear thinking and sensitivity in feeling, and the ability to carry these thoughts and feelings into action.

Safe

We value child safety and have zero tolerance for child abuse.

Diverse

We value the unique spiritual nature of every child, recognising that each is on an individual journey of biographical development. We appreciate the diversity of beliefs and experiences that each individual brings to our community and encourage collaboration over competition as the basis for both individual achievement and community harmony.

Creative

We value a shared creative journey in learning that brings together child, family and teacher. We value curiosity, imagination, beauty and wonder, and strive to protect these qualities as part of a lifelong love of learning.

Sustainable

Steiner education develops skills, knowledge and values that promote behaviour in support of a sustainable environment. We acknowledge humanity's interdependence with the future of the natural world. We aim to work in harmony with the forces of nature in a creative and collaborative manner, continuing the traditions of Rudolf Steiner's sustainable agricultural traditions (biodynamics), and working to foster respect for self, others and the environment.

- There are positive relationships between students and teachers, amongst the students themselves, and within the staff body.
- Teaching staff are professional and highly skilled, and are committed to the education, welfare and growth of the children.
- Staff participate in ongoing professional development to ensure that they continue to develop their skills and expertise.
- The property is large enough to accommodate our vision for the future development of the school and kindergarten.
- We have an Anthroposophical school health consultant visiting regularly to support teachers and children alike, and a skilled and experienced Head of School who guides college and staff in their work together.
- The continuing growth of Buninyong for potential enrolments.

We remain committed to developing the curriculum and improving learning outcomes for children. As prescribed in the annual School Improvement Plan, we focus on one curriculum area each year upon which we can further improve.

We have further developed our connections and contributions to the wider community working with a local organisation where students and the school community give back to those in need through community service. We have also nurtured a relationship with an international sister school.

Our students leave our school with confidence in themselves, in their skills and care and take interest in the world. They are well prepared for the next step in their educational Journey.

Goals:

• Within the requirements of our community - offer a year 7 and 8 program.



- Conflict resolution & restorative justice program running for students with a whole school approach including possible community workshops and teacher and student workshops.
- Children to regularly take part in local community events, such as musical performances; fundraising for humanitarian causes; tree planting and community service opportunities.
- Kindergarten and Prep to be operating 5 days a week due to increased enrolments.
- Regular connection opportunities with the local indigenous community.
- A second Kindergarten on site or in Ballarat central.
- Garden to kitchen program for the students.
- A School Bus.
- Playground equipment and sporting facilities considering the needs of all age groups including Classes 7 & 8.
- Offer a bush craft program.
- Offer Forest Early Childhood programs.
- A thriving and adventure based outdoor education program, streamlining class camps.
- A sister school connection with an international Steiner School.
- Students leave here with the skills and capacities needed to successfully transition to their various secondary schools across the private and state sector.
- Strong educational support program to support students of all abilities in our classes to reach their potential. This includes the regular teacher reflection, aides where needed, class movements and the Integrated Listening System Program.
- Student library to centralise books and resources.
- Provide the best Anthroposophical health and wellbeing program which includes Curative Eurythmy, Extra Lesson and Anthroposophical Medicine.



Our Vision for our Community



Our school community is healthy vibrant. Parents and eniov organising and participating in community events and fundraisers. The parents hold an annual parents' social function where everyone can come together to strengthen their connections. We have several workshops throughout the year those within held bv our community that have skills that can be shared within the wider community. We have regular parent talks to ensure all are aware of the benefits of a Steiner Education, and the benefits to parents on incorporating the philosophy into their own homes.

The health and wellbeing of staff, parents and children continue to be our priority. We have further developed our Anthroposophical health and wellbeing program that includes opportunities for parents and staff to benefit from Anthroposophical Medicine. We have strong connections with the wellbeing professional within our community and they hold workshops throughout the year.

We have become known in the wider community as a hub for educational workshops and as a place of excellence for the arts and music. We offer an annual art exhibition that raises our profile in the community and raises funds for the school.

Our Autumn Fair grows in strength every year, continuing to generate exposure for our school and an opportunity for parents to contribute to the growth of the school.

Our Vision for our Environment

As you enter the school, you are greeted by a beautiful water feature and kitchen garden overflowing with produce. The children work in the kitchen garden, growing food that they will harvest, prepare and eat together.

We have upgraded existing facilities, adding additional equipment for the children to enjoy. Our Master Plan is in place for the further development of the school site and we are planning for the next stage of development of the grounds and buildings.



Goals:

- Expand the current prep room to allow for extra enrolments.
- Focus on development of the property and the connection to the area across the dam – including a boardwalk around the dam.
- Relocate the Hard Craft area and incorporate a working maintenance space and storage.
- Increase the size of school kitchen gardens.
- Develop the site for the expansion into the year 7 and 8 program.
- Develop the site for a biodynamic farm.
- Develop the Early Learning area within the property.
- Build stronger connections with local environmental groups for assistance and advice on land development.
